LOW FAT-RASPBERRY YOCHURT CAKE



Grocery List:

Condensed Milk 1 tin
Whipping Cream 500 ml

Vanilla Essence 1 teaspoon/5 ml

Low fat Raspberry yoghurt 250 ml Raspberry 250 gm Milk 2 tsp

lcing sugar 1 tablespoon/15 gm

Method.

Add the condensed milk, cream and vanilla and beat the mixture for 8 - 10 minutes until it becomes foamy, light and frothy.

Carefully fold through the yoghurt

Mash together the raspberries and icing sugar and fold through the ice cream mixture.

Pour the ice-cream into a $22 \text{ cm} \times 11 \text{ cm}$ loaf tin, lined with cling film.

Freeze it overnight and serve it sliced with your desired toppings'.

Chocolate chips

Caramel, chocolate sauce


