The selfie corner was the cherry on the cake with parents eagerly posing for pictures along with their wards. #### Science Club



Inspired, encouraged and motivated by their teachers and parents, the budding scientists of DMCS displayed different models and experiments with great enthusiasm and excitement. The students created machines out of scrap material.

Our Tiny tots of grade I – V enthusiastically presented projects like food pyramids, Road traffic and traffic rules, different types of houses and a beautifully crafted Fort.

The middle school and high school students explained interesting phenomena and facts of Science. They displayed working models of different organs of the body like Lungs, Neurons, Kidneys and Brain. There were working models of simple machines like Magnetic Levitation, Hydraulic lift, simple electric motors, power generating plants like hydropower plant, wind mill, working model of solar system, elevators etc. There were models based on modern Technology like room heaters, security alarm, drip irrigation.

Students explained different principles of science by performing eye catching experiments like density of different substances, periscope, hologram, Newton's Cradle homopolar motor, reactions taking place in bath bomb etc. Designing 3D view rooms and objects from scratch using an app which can be used for educational purpose was created by one of our students. There was an interesting experiment of extraction of DNA from Banana peel by spooling method and the DNA was viewed under the

microscope. All these experiments were very well received and appreciated by captivated visitors.

It was an enriching and learning experience for all the students. The effort was really worthwhile for it served a dual purpose of giving the children a chance to display their artistic skills and also proved to be a learning experience, as they researched and gathered information for their projects and models. 


