DID YOU KNOW

1. The Arctic tern is the world's longest-distance flying bird. Each year it migrates from its Arctic breeding grounds to Antarctica, covering the longest distance of over 21,750 miles (35,000km) one way. Each year it makes a return trip of over 44,000 miles!



2. An elephant's trunk can weigh nearly 140kg. It is between 6-7ft. long and can hold about 4 liters of water. However, the big elephants can store up to 10-12 liters of water in their trunk. They don't drink water directly from their trunk but spray it into their mouths.



3. Cumulonimbus clouds have a thick mass with a flat base and bring thunder. These towering, vertical clouds are also called 'Thunderheads' and are associated with thunderstorms.



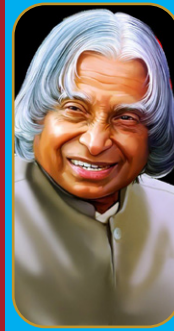

5. The study of fossils is called Palaeontology. Palaeontologists carefully study fossils of plants and animals to understand how they functioned. Moreover, fossils are an important key to knowing how and when life began on the earth.

presentations, interviews, and many other situations. We learn to find new ways to express emotions, tell stories, and make scenes come alive.

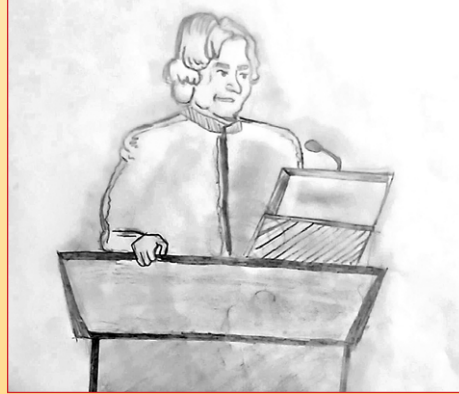
